Computer Club Monitors Volunteer Opportunity

The Computer Club has an ongoing need for Monitors to assist classroom Instructors and to make it possible to increase our Computer Room open hours. Serving as a Monitor is one way for members to have a more active role in the Club, learn more about the inner workings of the Club and to increase one's computer knowledge.

Monitors are the volunteers who make the Computer Room available for use by other Club members during both open sessions and computer classes. These are the people who obtain the key for opening the Room and are responsible for the Room while it's being used. Monitors are not expected to provide technical assistance beyond turning the equipment on/off and logging onto the Internet; even though some Monitors feel comfortable in providing computer help. Monitors are expected to serve the Club three hours/month.

Being a Monitor has the following perks:

- o Use of the computer Room whenever the key is available.
- o Auditing classes on computer subjects.

To be added to the Monitors List, completion of a two hour training course is required. The date and time of the next class will be announced and a sign-up sheet will be available in the Computer Room. Typically three classes are given each year.
